The **Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site** was built between 1896 and 1899 with 54 rooms. It was primarily used as a seasonal residence and is a symbol of the wealth of the Gilded Age. It is one of the area's oldest Hudson River estates.

The **Home of Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site** preserves the Springwood estate in Hyde Park. Springwood was the birthplace, lifelong home, and burial place of the 32nd President.







**Eleanor Roosevelt's Val-Kill Estate** was where she & her husband frequently entertained family, friends, political associates, and world leaders in a relaxed setting.

There is also a Wallace Nutting connection here, as he was friends with the Smiley's and spent time photographing this location and the surrounding area.
